- Family Fun Night and other all-village or all-tribe events.

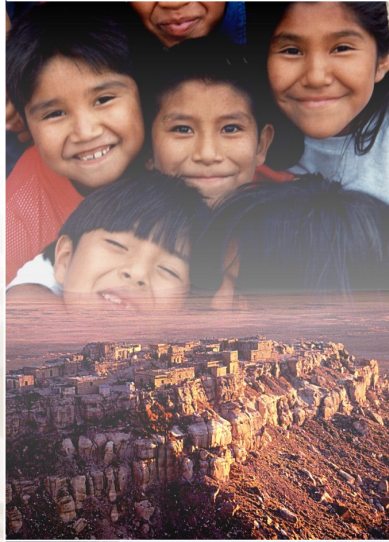
